Introduction :

❖ Daytime Speaker Sessions

The first day of E-Summit 2026 at IIT Bombay featured a series of highly insightful speaker sessions with distinguished entrepreneurs and industry leaders, including:

❖ Nighttime TTMM (15-Minute Pitch)

The evening featured the TTMM session, where startup founders presented their ventures in 15-minute pitches to potential investors. Founders whose funding crossed ₹35 lakh successfully signed deals, giving the delegation first-hand exposure to real-world startup investment processes, pitching techniques, and investor negotiations.

The day concluded with a special session by Aman Gupta, Co-founder of BOAT, who shared his entrepreneurial journey, challenges faced, and strategies for scaling startups. This session left the delegation inspired and motivated, equipping them with practical ideas to implement within MNIT Jaipur's E-Cell initiatives.

The day concluded with reflective discussions and networking opportunities, leaving the delegation inspired and prepared to translate the knowledge gained into strategic initiatives within MNIT Jaipur's E-Cell.

*EEI(Entrepreneurial Exposure Index) is an internal impact metric developed by E-Cell MNIT Jaipur to quantify the overall exposure generated by an event. It is calculated as: $EEI = \frac{P + EH/2 + 5M + D}{200}$ where P = Participation, EH = Engagement Hours, M = Mentor Network Engaged, and D = Digital Outreach. The index reflects the combined reach, engagement depth, and mentorship interaction created through the event
